From the Rabbi

<u>Gratitude</u>

It is wonderful to return refreshed and renewed from my eight weeks of Sabbatical. I was able to read and study in depth—both online and at a study program in New York. I renewed my commitment to daily prayer and reflection and was able to "sit in the pew" at other congregations. I am deeply grateful the many people who led services,



organized social programs, planned for holidays, taught and delivered divrei torah, and so much more in my absence. The depth of talent, commitment and compassion that exists at Congregation Beth Shalom is truly inspirational.

<u>Think Blue!</u>

We are rapidly approaching our celebration of the 25th anniversary of CBS on May 17. Many, many of you have contributed your 7 hours of volunteer time and earned your famous 'blue t-shirt'! If you have not yet done your volunteer hours, this is the time to step forward! We want our 'bodacious birthday bash' (as our President Jeff Newman calls it) to be a solid sea of blue. When our ancestors, the Children of Israel, heard Pharoah's army behind them, they were standing at their sea (red, not blue!), and they were waiting for it to part . . . and waiting . . . and waiting. The ancient rabbis teach that it wasn't until one courageous person (Nachshon) stepped forward and into the sea, that it actually separated. God's splitting of the sea—the culmination of the Exodus that we celebrate at our seders—was a response to human initiative, action and energy. We at CBS are waiting . . . If you have not yet volunteered, this is the time to take the initiative and step forward into the sea of blue!

Blessed are You God, for bringing me to this moment

As you read this, I will just have returned from the Hebrew Union College—Jewish Institute of Religion. It is the tradition of our seminary to grant an Honorary Doctorate of Divinity to rabbis on the 25th anniversary of their ordination. This year is that milestone in my life. My time on Sabbatical, and my return to this vibrant and dedicated community has renewed my awareness for the blessing of serving the Jewish people, and CBS in particular. I am honored to share this anniversary with Beth Shalom—United Together 25.

Pausing to Remember

Yom HaShoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day is a sacred day in the Jewish calendar. The need to fulfill the obligation to "Never Forget" is imperative in a world that all too often still exhibits hatred of Jews. Moreover, as the years go on, the opportunity to hear from those who witnessed the horror is diminishing. Too many in our community (our young people in particular) have never heard a first-person testimony from those who experienced and survived the Holocaust. Marie and Jeannette, sisters from Antwerp, Belgium, were just five and nine years old when they began a life on the run from the Nazis in 1940, including time in a deportation camp, and a dangerous journey without their mother across the Pyrenees mountains to Spain, and eventually to America. On Wednesday, April 8 (in advance of Yom HaShoah) we will be able to hear Marie tell her remarkable story here at CBS. Please plan to be with us, and bring a friend as well. The obligation to hear and transmit these stories has never been more critical.

have to be the 80 percent. But the 20 percent cannot do everything all the time. We all need to chip in once and a while and collaborate with our fellow congregants.

UT25 can become our blueprint for the next 25 years. This can be the model of volunteerism and commemoration for years to come—a legacy that we will pass on to future generations. We could have a UT26, UT27, UT 100.

I am passionate about UT25 and what it will do for our temple. I am also passionate about music. When Kevin starts the music playing on May 17, I want to hear the blues—music that is steeped in struggle, improvisation, structure, hope, enduring love and perseverance—just like our first 25 years. Then we will celebrate and have a good time.



Marie and Jeannette, sisters from Antwerp, Belgium, were just five and nine years old when they began a life on the run from the Nazis in 1940. The young girls hid in France until caught by the Nazis and put into a deportation camp. With the help of the underground they were smuggled out of the camp and taken to a safe hiding place. Eventually they escaped, without their mother across the Pyrenees mountains to Barcelona, Spain. In 1944 they journeyed to the United States and were placed in an orphanage until a foster home could be found for them in Rhode Islandbecoming the state's first refugee children from the Holocaust. We began the month of March with our Purim celebration. It was a blast! Thanks to all our parent volunteers and the Parent Association for planning, organizing and implementing a fun filled morning. We ran our celebration much as we have done for Chanukah in the past. The students were able to visit stations. Each station had a Purim-themed activity. We baked hamentaschen, had a scavenger hunt, threw balls at Haman and designed Esther's gown out of toilet paper. A big thanks and shout out to Dan Weinstein. Dan raised over \$51 for our Tzedakah Project (Sun Coast Guide Dogs and Israeli Guide Dogs) and was rewarded by having Lucas Oldman hit him in the face with a whipped cream pie. Nice aim, Lucas!

Each month I write about the importance of attendance and reporting to class on time. By now you know our Judaic curriculum builds upon past lessons. If a student has multiple absences, it will result in gaps in their Jewish Education. 

Donations

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other nonrestricted gifts.
- Building Fund: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/ restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- **Rabbi's Discretionary Fund**: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life**: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- **Yahrzeit Plaque**: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Unless otherwise noted by you, your gift will be acknowledged in the Kibbitzer the month following its receipt. If your donation is incorrectly listed or omitted, please notify the temple office immediately.




