In The Beginning

I have the honor to write an article for *The Kibbitzer*. I am one of seven families that started this congregation, and we also started and named *The Kibbitzer*. We began meeting at our homes and then started meeting in a Bloomingdale Plaza storefront. We were searching for a form of Judaism that everyone wanted. We started with a Chabad Lubavitch leader, Rabbi Levi Shemtov, and decided that was not the most inviting sect to grow. We held a meeting at the storefront and had so many people attend that they were inside and outside as well. The vote was reform Judaism.

Shortly after that meeting, we were offered a temporary home at Apostle Lutheran Church on Kingsway Road. We had many lay leaders to conduct Shabbat services, including myself. Bar and bat mitzvahs were led by Rabbi Fred Natkin, who was borrowed from Winter Haven. Our Sunday school was at the preschool, then at Susana Blake's Children's Academy Brandon, and then moved to Brandon Academy for many years until we built our own synagogue.

Rabbi Robert Goodman stayed with us for several years. He asked me to be the cantorial soloist in 1992 and taught me Shabbat music basics. Rabbi Goodman and I also conducted services in Sun City Center two Friday nights a month and then two Friday nights a month in Brandon until we had the demand for Shabbat services every week. We did bar and bat mitzvahs and weddings together as well.

After his contract ended, we had a wonderful student, Marci Bellows, for the next three years. She was attending Hebrew Union College in New York and traveled every weekend. She now has a pulpit of her own and a family in the Chicago area.

We had intermittent or retired rabbis hiring our first permanent rabbi, Rabbi Betsy Torop. We built our temple in 2003, and that is when Rabbi Torop started as well. Our Sunday school had almost 100 children. Build it and they will come is an expression but also a fact! I have been a teacher and the music teacher for 20 years.

I have enjoyed every minute of my time with Congregation Beth Shalom, which was named in 1990. Prior to that, we were called the Jewish Congregation of Brandon.

Our congregation was primarily based on welcoming the stranger, and this was our mission statement. Many of us came from temporary associations with other temples in Tampa. Our congregation of people are some of the most friendly, devoted and caring people you would ever want to meet. They have made a big difference in my life. I love my congregants, and I don't know what I would do without them. We all come together in times of joy and sorrow to share life and give lots of support and love. I feel that we will prevail in our future and hope that you will be a part of our family and share in our joys (simchas). Please continue to support our home.

KOLOT SHOLOM NOTES

In beginning my review of High Holy Day music, I came upon this article by Michael Reid Winikoff.

The High Holy Days, formally known as the Yamim Noraim or "Days of Awe," include the major observances of Rosh Hashanah (New Year) and Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement) but actually comprise a continual season that begins in earnest with the inaugural recitation of S'lichot (the penitential liturgy) starting the Saturday night at least four days prior to Rosh Hashanah. According to tradition, the season represents a time when all creatures stand in judgment before Adonai.

To a greater degree than with Shabbat, the music of the High Holy Days features so-called "misinai" (from Sinai) tunes, a euphemism for the ancient, authentic nature of such chants as Kol Nidre, Aleinu Hagadol and other passages, as though they had been

handed down at Sinai (though most date from the Middle Ages or later). This year our congregation is blessed to have Cantor Friedler celebrate our High Holy Days with us. We've become familiar with the cantor's wonderful voice and leadership over the past few months, and I know the members of Kolot Shalom are truly looking forward to singing with him.

As in years past, I invite all those who would like to join us in lifting their voices and enriching our services to come to our first rehearsal Monday, Aug. 13, at 7 p.m. I personally can't wait to work with him and to gain new insights into our musical heritage! 



DONATIONS

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- Building Fund: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- Rabbi's Discretionary Fund: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- Youth Group Fund: a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- Tree of Life: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- Yahrzeit Plaque: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.
