Remembering Kevin Frye z"l

Change is an inevitable part of life. When we begin to think about Rosh Hashanah, we are more acutely aware of this inevitability. We think about what has occurred in the year that has passed – the joys and the sorrows. The prayers draw our attention to the fragility of life, and against the backdrop of these powerful words and sacred melodies we think about our hopes and dreams for the year ahead.



During these High Holy Days, we will deeply miss Kevin Frye of blessed memory. His beautiful voice, his commitment to Jewish tradition, his warm manner, and his deep love for our congregation have enriched our High Holy Day services beyond measure. For many in our community, Kevin's rich voice was the essence of the High Holy Day experience – the gateway to meaningful prayer and inspiration. His death was a tragic loss to his beloved family and to our community.

While nothing will alleviate this sense of loss, we are fortunate to welcome a wonderful cantor to our bimah this year. Cantor Pamela Siskin is a deeply caring person as well as a skilled musician. As an ordained cantor, she shares not only a rich musical background but a passion for creating meaningful prayer. Her warmth and sensitivity are a wonderful match for our congregation. I know you will join me in welcoming her and strive to appreciate the unique gifts she will bring to our High Holy Day worship.

Meet Cantor Pamela Siskin



Cantor Pamela Siskin was born in London and studied music at Trinity College in London and opera at The London Opera Studio. After singing with The Royal Opera for several years, she became Principal Mezzo-Soprano with the Israel National Opera. In 1985, she decided to continue her musical and religious studies in the Unites States. Cantor Siskin became a student at the Hebrew Union College in New York City, earning a master's degree in Sacred Music and, more recently, was awarded an Honorary Doctorate of Music. She was ordained in 1989. During her studies she served pulpits in East Falmouth, Mass., and New Jersey before

joining Congregation Beth Israel, West Hartford, Conn., where she served for 18 years and became Cantor and Director for Lifelong Learning. Cantor Sisken created The Jewish Spiritual Theater Company using community talent to perform original plays and music based on Jewish texts and political events pertaining to the Jewish people. Cantor Siskin became an American citizen in 1993 and, in 2003 she was recognized by the state of Connecticut as an Immigrant Citizen of the Year for achievements and leadership.

It's only been 40 years ...

Though you probably can't see all the faces in the partial photo on the top, more than 40 years have passed from the time it was taken, to this past July 1, when the photo on the bottom was taken. I'm seated in the first photo. Finding me in the photo on the right is like a "Where's Waldo" puzzle, but I'm there.



Our teens at CBS participate in Beth Shalom Temple Youth (BESTY), part of the North American Federation of Temple Youth. When I was in high school, I was a member of the B'nai Brith Youth Organization – AZA (boys) and BBG (girls).

Carol Anne and I attended a BBYO reunion in Orlando. Though my group in Jacksonville was a part of the North Florida Region, which included Daytona Beach, Gainesville, Orlando, and Tampa, this reunion included groups from the whole state who participated from 1969 to 1980.

The above photo was taken at a regional convention that was held at Camp Keystone, located northwest of Tampa. I don't believe it still exists. Nor do I remember much about the bus ride from Jacksonville to Tampa. However, I vividly recall being on a smaller bus, en route to camp, and seeing the Buccaneers' stadium for the first time, commonly referred to as "The Sombrero." Dale Mabry in 1972 "ended" at Hillsborough Avenue. It really didn't, but Carrollwood was in its infancy and was nothing like it is today.

Looking back, it's amazing to see the changes and what has transpired with people within this group I was so close to. Two couples, who attended and met as teenagers, are married. Another couple who married met, I believe, as children. One of these couples survived Hurricane Andrew huddled inside a closet. One of the people who attended is a past president of Congregation Rodeph Sholom. One of the guys pictured could not attend. He's incarcerated. And one of the guys, whom I met for the first time at the reunion, co-wrote *Groundhog Day* with Harold Ramis, which was recently turned into a musical, currently on Broadway! A prayer was said for those who had passed, and at the dinner Saturday night a short Havdalah service was held.

The reunion had such a relaxed feel about it. Perhaps, at this stage in our lives, the need to size each other up no longer exists. We live, we marry, remarry in some cases, remarry again, in other cases, have children, grandchildren, etc. Everyone was happy. It was great!

Our Annual Fundraiser and Special Olympics Healthy Community Tampa Bay

Congregation Beth Shalom partnered with this charity for the second year in a row. As a result of our fundraiser, Denim &





Pearls, \$1,300 was given to them.

Allison Rapp, site director for the charity, is also one of our congregants! This year, CBS was asked to donate health message kits, which are on order. According to Allison, "Health messages is an evidence-based peer-topeer health promotion leadership and advocacy program for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) and their support persons. Healthy lifestyle coaches (people with I/DD) and their mentors (support persons) are trained to deliver health and wellness lessons once a week for 12 weeks to a class of 10-15 individuals with I/DD. At the end, the coaches and their mentors assist students in creating health goals and are given two bracelets with a health message on it. The second bracelet is for the student to share with a friend. family member or teammate to help spread the health message. The lesson topics include engaging in more physical activity, eating healthy and drinking water."

In a recent conversation we had, Allison said the charity is very pleased to have partnered with us these past two years and would be happy to partner again with us for the upcoming event in 2018. We thank you, Allison, and Special Olympics Healthy Community Tampa Bay!

Rebekats Reskues

Rebekah Dugan's b'nai mitzvah project is short-term fostering underweight/underage kittens from the Hillsborough County Pet Resource Center.

Due to logistical restraints, kittens who are under two pounds are not able to remain in the shelter. Rebekah fosters the kittens in residence, taking care of them until they reach eight weeks and exceed two pounds, at which time they are returned to the shelter and are placed for adoption.

As part of the fostering process, Rebekah is also socializing the kittens, which increases the likelihood of their being adopted.

Rebekah has names her project "Rebekats Reskues." To date, she has successfully fostered 4 kittens. She plans to continue fostering kittens for years to come.

DONATIONS

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- Building Fund: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- Rabbi's Discretionary Fund: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- Youth Group Fund: a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life**: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- Yahrzeit Plaque: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.
