From the Rabbi

From Our Community ...

We are truly a lucky congregation. We have a lot of amazing volunteers. I have counted up those who volunteer in some way – from hosting an oneg to greeting, from working on a committee to reading torah, from helping at a Chanukah party to stepping into the kitchen at a moment's notice. The



percentage of the congregation who contributes in some way – as a volunteer or a financial supporter – is remarkable. And it is crucial, because we operate with a very, very small part-time staff. Mags Oldman, our administrative director, has been a crucial member of our staff. As of Nov. 18, Mags has left the position of administrative director to pursue full-time work. We are happy for the opportunities this provides for her and her family and wish her only the best. At the same time, we acknowledge that she will be deeply missed – her warmth and creativity, her hard work and dedication to the temple way above and beyond what her formal job requires have made a true difference to us all. She has been a remarkable help to me and enabled me to be a more effective rabbi to our community. We are fortunate that she is not leaving our temple family and will continue to be our youth director, involved with many aspects of our congregation. While we are searching for a new administrator, more of our wonderful volunteers will be stepping in to help. We know you will be understanding and patient during this time of transition.

To the Jewish People ...

The Jewish calendar is a quirky thing. From a few years ago when Chanukah fell on Thanksgiving weekend to this year when the first night of Chanukah is on Dec. 24, we are constantly juggling the interface between "our" holidays and the holidays on the secular calendar. The intersection of Chanukah and Christmas provides both an opportunity and a challenge. For the many of us with non-Jewish family members, we can easily celebrate together, affirming and upholding the light and joy of our individual holidays. At the same time, we are challenged not to make Chanukah another Christmas — a yearly challenge in our commercialized world that is all the more acute when they fall on the same days. Chanukah is not the "Jewish Christmas." Its message — the upholding of Jewish identity in a hostile environment and the miracle of light in the darkness — is far different from the joy of Jesus' birth that is central to Christmas. And Chanukah is a relatively minor holiday in the Jewish calendar. While celebrating together, we must strive to remember the special nature of "our" holiday, and honor the unique message that Chanukah brings.

To the World at Large ...

As I write these words, we are still in the midst of post-election turbulence. This feeling seems unlikely to subside anytime soon, as the passions and ideals that animated our election for president do not simply disappear when the last vote is counted. I spoke about this very unique moment in time on the Erev Shabbat following the election. 

According to Wikipedia, it was the result of the interception between the lunisolar Hebrew calendar and the time of the solar year, which can have between 353 and 385 days per year, and the Gregorian calendar. Because the two are not calculated the same way, Chanukah appears at a different time each year on the Gregorian calendar.

Now fast forward to this year: Chanukah will fall on Christmas Eve. That's almost a month different from the date of Thanksgivukah in 2013. Christmas and Chanukah have come together four previous times in the last century, 1918, 1921, 1959 and 2005. I don't know if this year we'll create a new celebration name like Chrismukah. What do you think? Just an interesting thought.

DONATIONS

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- Building Fund: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/ restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- Rabbi's Discretionary Fund: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- Youth Group Fund: a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life**: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- Yahrzeit Plaque: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.

Unless otherwise noted by you, your gift will be acknowledged in the Kibbitzer the month following its receipt. If your donation is incorrectly listed or omitted, please notify the temple office immediately.
