Sabbatical is Health, Wholeness and Renewal

"Life can only be perfected through the affording of a breathing space from the bustle of everyday life" - Rav Kook, Shabbat Ha'Aretz

Rav Kook was right. We all need to find ways for rest and renewal, to replenish our spirits and souls, which can be all too easily drained from the daily demands placed upon us. Shabbat provides that opportunity



for all of us on a weekly basis. And I am grateful that CBS has granted me four months of rabbinic sabbatical: January -February 2015 and February-March 2016.

Sabbatical will provide me with the opportunity for in-depth study and learning along with spiritual reflection and growth. Day-to-day rabbinic life (meetings and hospital visits, teaching and planning) often does not allow for the kind of study, personal prayer and reflection that is necessary for my own rabbinic growth, growth that will in turn enrich and strengthen my ability to serve as your rabbi.

What will I be doing?

I have a number of plans for study and learning over the course of the eight weeks. I will be participating in an intensive text study at Mechon Hadar Beit Midrash in New York. I plan to do several on-line courses and webinars, including a course at the Mussar Institute. (Mussar is a path of contemplative practices and exercises that have evolved over the past thousand years to help facilitate individual spiritual growth.) I have plans for additional learning (on-line and with a newly published book) on Abraham Joshua Heschel. Books on Israel, Bible, synagogue management, faith and technology are also part of the program I am developing.

In addition to the spiritual work with the Mussar Institute, I plan to visit a number of synagogues in the area on Shabbat and weekdays. The opportunity to observe how others lead worship and celebrate Shabbat, and to be a member of the worshipping community, will not only nourish my own spirit, but will help enrich my role as worship leader.

What programs will take place at the synagogue during my sabbatical?

All of them! B'nai Mitzvah tutoring, planning for our UT 25 birthday bash, Religious School, Confirmation, Torah Tots, Healing Circle and choir will all continue as usual. Rehearsals for Frozen: The Purim Shpiel will be well underway and advertising for our wonderful Shabbat Retreat on March 28 will be in full swing. I am working with the ritual committee to plan for meaningful worship. Erev Shabbat services will be filled with wonderful and unique programs - speakers about Jews around the world and other guests, our newly designed family services, and a musical Shabbat Alive! We are blessed with talented leaders, teachers and teens and I am grateful for their dedication that makes this sabbatical possible.

What do I do if I have a personal or family crisis?

The rabbis of the area synagogues have agreed to be help out in the case of an emergency. Please call the Temple office, or our president Jeff Newman (813-758-4120). They will know whom to call, and how to reach me when appropriate. I will be on Sabbatical December 24-February 23. I am full of joy and immense gratitude for the opportunity. When I return, I look forward to sharing with you the blessings I know I will receive. If you have questions, feel free to be in touch.

What community conversation has taught me...

I ponder on how and why I am President of our congregation. I mean, I came from a culturally religious family, but not a spiritually religious family. In my area of the country you saw other Jews (suburban NY), but I never felt connected to Judaism or practiced it. I never dated a Jew, did not go to synagogue until we had kids, lived in areas of the country not particularly Jewish (Indiana and Wisconsin) and I really did not care if I aligned with a temple or not. Suzanne was the driving force for us finding religion for our family.

I thought my story was an outlier until a few weeks ago... Does my story sound familiar to you?

The Rabbi and I are in the middle of our community conversations. The Rabbi always asks the same opening question, "what made you initially come to Congregation Beth Shalom?" The answers, amazingly to me, are many times a version of my story. In fact, I never knew the commonality amongst our membership in terms of our personal journey. This communality gives our community challenges and opportunities.

Some of the challenges?

How do we strengthen our membership when many potential new members do not have an internal drive to connect with Judiasm? What about some of our own members, who are indifferent about where CBS fits in their life. How do we make many of our mixed families feel comfortable in a religion that is both inclusive and exclusive? These questions are thought provoking and need to be addressed.

What are the opportunities?

In a previous article, I talked about how it only takes 10 minutes to reach out and start a connection with others in temple. For many of us, this is not an easy task, especially when you feel you are not at the same religious "status" or that your story is unusual. Through our conversations, we are finding that our common story can bridge us together. Ask the same question that Rabbi asks and you will find that instant link that will forge a new, deeper, relationship.



Another opportunity is that there are many like me who feel unqualified for leadership

position simply because they are "not Jewish enough." It is stunning how many temple leaders were just like me, but it did not stop their commitment to the next generations of CBS families. Being not Jewish enough is "head trash," something that can stop you from a truly enriching temple experience.

I should know, I had that "head trash" until we started our discussions.

Thanks to all the participants of Community Conversations for helping me (and others in the group) understand the similarities we have, and how we can strengthen our temple by sharing their personal journeys.







Donations

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- **Building Fund**: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/ restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- Rabbi's Discretionary Fund: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- **Adopt-A-Book**: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life**: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- **Yahrzeit Plaque**: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.
