From the Rabbi

Mishkan HaNefesh – What are the Operating Instructions?

Much of this *machzor* (High Holy Day prayer book) follows the two-page spread format of *Mishkan T'filah* (our Shabbat prayer book). However, the use of three distinctive page styles creates greater variety in the present volumes.

This *machzor* has been structured to encourage individuals to participate at their own pace and in their own way. Some may wish to focus on a commentary or a challenging poem while the congregation sings a prayer. *Mishkan HaNefesh* features three kinds of pages: WHITE pages with three basic elements—a traditional Hebrew prayer, a faithful translation, and a transliteration; GRAY-tinted pages for alternative translations, poems, counter-texts, and creative readings; and bordered, BLUE-tinted pages for study texts or silent meditations. All three have commentary of a spiritual, historical or literary nature at the bottom of the page, as well as source citations. Thus this *machzor* encourages learning both during worship and in preparation for the High Holy Days.

Mishkan HaNefesh – What does the Name Mean – and What does it Teach Us?

In the Book of Exodus, we read that artisans designed and built a *mishkan* (a dwelling place, or sanctuary) for Israel's communal worship of the God who wrought the miracle of freedom. The word *nefesh* usually means soul of person. One way to translate *Mishkan HaNefesh* is "Sanctuary of the Soul," which suggests that each person's spiritual quest happens within the holy space of the community. We hope that this *machzor* will be a "meeting place" for the inner life of each individual, the warm embrace of community, and the sacred traditions of the Jewish people.

What Other Opportunities will there be to learn about the new prayer book?

There are copies available for you to look at in the lobby of the Temple.

Beginning in August, for the month before Rosh Hashanah, explanatory videos will be available on our website, and very brief teachings will be available through email.

Teaching about the prayer book will occur on some Friday nights in August.

At the Open House, on August 23, a 15-minute learning session will provide a brief overview for all who are interested.

All of these opportunities will allow you to see the three colored pages, view some of the art work that is in the prayer book or read a brief teaching or poem. These are the steps that will open us up to the possibilities that this prayer book presents to encounter the two all important themes of Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur: *t'shuvah* (return) and *cheshbon hanefesh* (accounting of the soul). I look forward to taking the journey with you.

Kiss the Girl

So I had to take the initiative. Thankfully, Laurel did not slap my face. Every subsequent relationship I have had, these words always rang true— you have to go for it if you truly want it. Even if things do not work out (and they did not always), you are better off committing than to hope things work out.

But my grandfather’s message of risk and reward is not just about romantic relationships—it’s about all relationships.

Hope is not a strategy, it is a delay tactic.

We can hope that temple finances turn around. We can hope that we bring in new members. We can hope that our current members feel revitalized towards CBS. We can hope we find future leadership. The list of hopes can be endless.

This next year’s budget is based on some sound financial principles and was drafted by some very wise men and women. But we are hoping that we bring in the revenue we need to grow our temple.

Hoping is not a strategy to run a temple.

We need action, the kiss, in order to strengthen our temple. I need action from all of you to grow our temple to our true potential.



I now understand the real meaning in my grandfather’s words. You can not wait for action, it must come from you. Just like going for your first kiss, there is a combination of guts, angst, focus and drive that makes any commitment worthwhile. Doing new things and truly committing to any endeavor are daunting tasks to many of us. But the rewards are plentiful.



We are a Jewish community that relies on a collective effort to obtain our goals. During the summer months, do an internal gut check. Are you *hoping for our best* or are you putting in the maximum effort.

Act It makes all the difference.

Tempted, Mislead, Slaughtered - The Short Life of Hitler Youth, Paul B.

June 6 to July 18, Florida Holocaust Museum 55 5th Street South, St. Petersburg, 33701

Originally developed and shown in the Documentation Center Nazi Party Rally Grounds in Nuremberg, Germany, in 2004, the exhibition narrates the story of the nazification of the youth of Germany focusing on the life and death of Paul Bayer. It shows how the Nazi state, through its control of the education system and through a massive propaganda effort, was able to seduce the youth of Germany into active participation in its destructive mission.

Holocaust by Bullets: Yahad – In Unum, 10 Years of Investigation

May 19 to July 19, Florida Holocaust Museum 55 5th Street South, St. Petersburg, 33701

Father Patrick Desbois has spent his life researching the Holocaust, fighting antisemitism, and furthering relations between Catholics and Jews. The exhibition focuses on Father Desbois and Yahad – In Unum's research in Eastern Europe, where they seek out eyewitnesses to the executions of Jews and Roma as they work toward identifying each execution site and mass grave.



Bring a light dinner and join us as the presenter of the month leads us in the discussion. Presented by Phyllis Newman


Philip Roth is one of my favorite authors. About ten years ago, this book was on the URJ's reading list. I read it then and am enjoying reading it now.



Donations

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- **General Fund** (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- **Building Fund:** A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- **Endowment Fund:** Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- **Religious School Scholarship Fund:** These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- **Rabbi's Discretionary Fund:** a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- **Adopt-A-Book:** A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- **Bricklets:** For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life:** The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- **Yahrzeit Plaque:** To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.
