Think before you speak

Last month, I got a birthday gift from my daughter of *The New York Times* online. It is my favorite paper and I love the crosswords, business day, international news, and travel. But my favorite part is the opinions as they are always thought provoking to me.

In an opinion written by Charles Blow right after the Roseanne remarks, he talked about how he reacts as a black man to racist comments. My favorite quote was "racism diminish the racist." When he hears someone use racist remarks, he does not get angry, he just realizes how uninformed, and insensitive the person who stated it is.

We as Jews have all been subjected to anti-Semitic remarks in our lifetime. I remember people thinking that I had horns when I was growing up. I remember people rolling pennies at me in gym class. I remember seeing people look in horror that I did not believe in Christmas. And everyone assumes that I am the cheapest person in room (OK, they might be right.) When I hear people state anti-Semitic remarks at me, I normally feel less of that person.

This also relates to our community at CBS. Over the past few months, our threads of civility have been ripping away. The underlying values of our congregation have been slowly eroding. History teaches us that in times of stress, we try to find scapegoats. Whether it has been Blacks, Jews, Asians , Hispanics, Muslims, or other groups I have not mentioned, it is human nature to point the finger at someone else instead of pointing the finger at yourself.

Now we are pointing fingers at our fellow family members of CBS. I have heard and have been subject to comments and accusations that are uncalled for in our temple. When I hear respected members of our temple demeaning other people, it is the same as anti- Semitic comments that people use outside the walls of our temple. It deflects people looking at the real problem and diminishes the person making the accusation. The accusers instantaneously lose respect from others at the congregation and makes it difficult for a solution to move forward.

Diminishing others so that your voice is louder will never, ever be the way to solving our temple's issues.

We all love Congregation Beth Shalom. We all have good intentions even if our ideas and approaches are different. We all want our future generations to worship in the same place that have instilled our values. So I implore you that this is the time to start talking with people and not against people.





EDUCATION— Sheila Fishman

The religious school of Congregation Beth Shalom is getting a face lift. We all know that as we age, we need to spruce up a bit. We are taking this summer to do just that.

Throughout the summer meetings will be held with parents of children from pre-kindergarten through 10th grade. We are providing online surveys to solicit everyone's comments. We are reinstituting a Youth Education Committee that will oversee the function of the religious school.

Here are some of the potential changes for the upcoming year:

• Torah Tots is being revamped among the interested parents to be held monthly with interactive games, storytelling, and Jewish traditions. We want to introduce our youth group to the Torah Tots. These teens are amazing and can certainly serve as role models to our youngest children.

• Religious school needs to accommodate a smaller enrollment and meet the needs of our younger families. After speaking with multiple authorities—locally and nationally, we will move to a one day a week program and offer a special session for children in need of enhancing Hebrew skills. This session will be arranged with parents. We recognize we may have to combine grades, but we are doing everything we can to ensure the needs of our children are the No.1 consideration.

We are developing a curriculum for Judaica and Hebrew. The goal of the curriculum proposed is to create easy-to-use, interactive lessons to connect and augment the Jewish values taught last year.

The focus of the year is the exploration of comprehensive, but brief portrait of significant Jewish stories. Students will become connected to the stories from the Torah through modern Jewish history. They will connect to those who have impacted the world in fundamentally Jewish ways and can inspire young Jews. These stories will enable them to identify with the Jewish people.

Jewish History: Students will develop a meaningful identification with the legacy of Jews past and present.
Jewish Values: Values help guide our behavior and inform our choices, connecting Jews to every aspect of Judaism.
Jewish Life: Jews have an obligation to act justly in our community and the world.

B'nai Mitzvah Tutoring

The torch has been passed from Keren Vergon to Rudina Richter and Michael Lubin. Both Rudina and Michael will work closely with the parents and students to design a program that meets the needs of each B'nai Mitzvah.

Confirmation

We are developing a program with a cadre of teachers who will address social issues within the context of Jewish values.

We will look within the temple for guest presenters as well as outside the CBS community. We will be conducting a meeting very soon with parents and confirmation students to develop a list of topics that they wish to address.

Bottom line: We need everyone's help in our redesign!

RABBI SEARCH COMMITTEE—Sheila Fishman

Dear Congregation Beth Shalom Members,

We are delighted to inform you that Rabbi Bryan Mann has accepted our invitation to visit with us during the weekend of Friday, July 6 through Sunday, July 8.

Rabbi Bryan completed his rabbinic studies at Hebrew College of Newton Centre, MA and was ordained June 3. During his final three years of Rabbinic studies, he served as a Social

Justice Intern at Congregation Mishkan Tefilah. This was preceded by two Rabbinic Internships at Congregation Betenu in Amherst, NH and Synagogue Adas Yoshuron in Rockland, ME. During his one-year internship with Congregation Betenu, he had a strong significant educational role and developed an all-school programming appropriate for the developmental stages of kindergarten through 7thgraders. He found ways for the older and younger students to work together, empowering the older students to be mentors and teachers themselves while empowering the younger students to participate in the conversations and activities.

From August 2012 through May 2015, he taught Hebrew classes at Temple Sinai, a large Reform congregation in Brookline MA. During that time, Bryan also led Kabbalat

Shabbat and Ma'ariv services at Moishe Kavod House in Brookline and Keshet Boston. During the summer of 2015 he served as a Summer Chaplain Intern at Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston. Since August 2015, Bryan has been studying in Jerusalem, where he is an Israel Fellow of T'ruah: The Rabbinic Call for Human Rights.

You are invited to meet Rabbi Bryan on Friday, July 6, when he will lead our evening Shabbat service, which begins at 7 p.m. Following our service, the rabbi will join us in our oneg rabbinic candidate.

DONATIONS

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- **Building Fund**: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/ restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- **Religious School Scholarship Fund:** These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- **Rabbi's Discretionary Fund:** a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- Youth Group Fund: a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life**: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- **Yahrzeit Plaque**: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.
