<u> Tov l'hodot – It is good to give thanks</u>

The approach of our annual congregational meeting provides a good opportunity to reflect on the year that has past. Each year when I look back, I am struck by the number of you who have made a contribution – of time, talent or resources – to Congregation Beth Shalom. This year is no different. The membership list is not only a list of names. It is a list of contributions, large and small, to the building of our



synagogue community. Some of you sit on the board of directors, chair a committee or sit on a

committee. Some of you organized, worked at or solicited contributions for Denim & Pearls. Some of you donated to the High Holy Day appeal or in memory of a loved one. Some of you organized an oneg Shabbat or donated something to help enrich the community building that occurs at each oneg. Some of you cooked a meal for members who are sick or struggling with bereavement. Some of you helped at Sukkah under the Stars or our Chanukah celebration. Some of you raised new ideas and possibilities for our synagogue.

Your partnership and willingness to contribute is what makes Congregation Beth Shalom not just a name, a building, an address – but a true community. And for that, I say, in the words of the psalmist (psalm 92) "Tov l'hodot Adonai – it is good to give thanks to God." The Holy One of Blessing is reflected in the blessings that you offer to us in everything you do.

What is your next step? Volunteering your time or talents to the synagogue is not only a matter of agreeing to do a needed task (although that is certainly appreciated!) Volunteering is something that should enrich your spirit, bring you fulfillment and joy. What does that for you? Is it knowing that you've brought joy to someone by calling them to say Shabbat Shalom? Is it seeing our young people grow in their connection to Jewish tradition? Is it helping make sure that the synagogue lives up to its mission to be welcoming to everyone? Is it building bridges with churches and mosques that strengthen us all? Is it finding ways to help us contribute to the community at large through acts of mitzvot? How can your contribution to the synagogue bring you meaning? Whether quietly behind the scenes or in a leadership role, what form of involvement and contribution to our synagogue family will bring you fulfillment and meaning?

I am grateful for all that you have done, and blessed in the knowledge that many of you will continue to explore your next steps as committed members of Beth Shalom. In a well-known teaching in Pirkei Avot 2:16 (the teachings of our ancestors), we are told "It is not up to you to finish the work, but you are not free to avoid it altogether." What is your next step?

Can We All Get Along?

Perhaps you read Gary Gould's article in the March 24 – April 6, edition of the *Jewish Press*. This article, titled "The Wisdom of Rodney King and the Haredim: Part 3" was long, but interesting.

He writes about how the hate crimes that have flooded Jewish communities across America have put a lot of us in an everlasting state of alertness. "To be alert is a good thing, but the anxiety produced can be quite debilitating." Gould gives two possibilities for the recent rise in these detestable acts. "One being the recent contentious bid for the White House. The other could be the recent settlement expansion in Israel."

In his article, rather than focus on the reasons of why, Gould turns his attention to the fact that "We're under attack on many different fronts and now more than ever, when we truly need to stand together, many people are creating conflict in our North American Jewish community. Or, are withdrawing from it because of partisan political differences."

"Like all Synagogues and churches, with 501 (c) (3) nonprofit status, we need to go out of our way to not take political stands." I agree with Gould's statement as it applies to what we do at CBS. As president, I, along with the rest of the CBS board, have a responsibility to "hide our political leanings" and unite. This was the main reason the executive committee chose to monitor what gets posted to our Facebook pages. We should reserve our own individual pages for our individual political views. I've already seen how two individuals, who were completely polarized politically on one Facebook page, now work together, side by side on a committee. Gould writes, "sure, we have a plurality of very diverse opinions – we're all Jews after all, but we need to agree to disagree, civilly and with diplomacy and not pull back from one another or from the community because of red/blue perspectives."

Who are the haredim? This is a group of ultra-Orthodox Jews in Israel. Their

income level is well under the poverty-line. "In most of these households, the women are the sole bread winners while the men study Torah most of the day. Most of us would frown upon their unhealthy lifestyle. Little exercise, poor diet, etc. And yet, haredi men live three years longer than the rest of the Israeli male population. The haredi women live 18 months longer than other women.

Why do the haredi live so long? Researchers indicate it may be due to the multiple ways the haredim are connected to their communities, social trust and the absence of significant political discord"

To quote Karen Dawkins, who is co-owner and managing editor of the *Jewish Press*, "I can never recall so much division and passions running this high." The tone of the correspondence she's received is angrier than she can remember.

As for the "Philosophy of Rodney King," recall he was arrested and beaten by Los Angeles police in 1992. As a result of the police actions being acquitted, subsequent rioting was responsible for 55 deaths and numerous injuries. Rodney King pleaded, "I just want to say, you know, can we all get along? Can we get along?"

"Make no mistake, the future well-being of our Jewish community depends on it." Well said!

Once again, if you are interested in joining us or would like to assist in one area of our future programming, please reach out to Sheila Fishman.





People of the Book is a fictionalized account of the Sarajevo Haggadah, a 600-



year-old illuminated book, one of the earliest of its kind. It chronicles the attempts of a young Australian conservator, Hannah Heath, to trace the journey and the origin of the Haggadah, using the beguiling clues in its binding. Brooks' story telling gift gently uncovers the layers of the book's history, taking the reader in a backward trajectory from 1940 to Sarajevo, Vienna, Venice, Tarragona and finally Seville. The story involves the Vatican, the mausoleums and the treasure-seeking Nazis.



DONATIONS

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- **Building Fund**: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/ restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- **Religious School Scholarship Fund:** These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- **Rabbi's Discretionary Fund:** a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- Youth Group Fund: a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life**: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- Yahrzeit Plaque: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.
