From the Rabbi

The Blessing of Rejuvenation

It is a joy to be back with the congregation after the last portion of my sabbatical. The time away enabled me to read, study, reflect and travel, enriching my mind and my spirit in a deep and meaningful way. I did many things during my eight weeks away from the congregation. I continued my online class in *mussar*, the Jewish



ethical tradition that helps students create a personal, spiritual curriculum for internal growth and reflection. I hope to finish the course this summer and then begin to learn how to teach and lead others in the *mussar* tradition. I also read many books, including Dan Ephron's powerful exploration of the assassination of Yitzhak Rabin (*Killing a King*) and Rabbi Jonathan Sack's study of extremism in the modern world (*Not in God's Name: Confronting Religious Violence*). I studied Hebrew and listened to webinars on contemporary issues in Israel taught by noted scholars in preparation for a wonderful, thought-provoking, challenging and joyous two weeks in Israel.

The Miracle of Israel in the 21st Century - A First Hand Report

My time in Israel was the highlight of my sabbatical. I spent a week learning with three hundred Reform colleagues at our annual rabbinic conference, and then a week on vacation in Tel-Aviv, learning, exploring and experiencing the beauty of Israel's most cosmopolitan city. The experiences that I have most reflected upon since returning home fall into three major areas. First, the tension that Israelis are wrestling with between democracy and security, between openness and safety. Listening to Knesset speakers (in a live Knesset committee meeting), meeting Members of Knesset (the Israeli parliament) from across the political spectrum, and spending a day of in-depth and on the ground learning about East and West Jerusalem - all of these experiences brought the dilemmas of Israeli life and decision making to life. Second, the encounter with the growing Reform movement in Israel was inspirational. We spent one Shabbat in a dynamic Reform congregation outside of Jerusalem and another Shabbat at a new congregation in Tel Aviv. Along with hundreds of rabbis we prayed at the place that may one day be an egalitarian section of the kotel (the Western Wall) along with the current men and women's section. The Reform movement is bringing Judaism alive in new and important ways for thousands of Israelis. Finally, despite all of the challenges and issues facing Israel, I was full of wonder simply walking the streets. Watching families buy Purim costumes on their way home from school, the explosion of the foodie scene, the Muslim, secular and Jewish families on the beach on Shabbat afternoon, the coffee maker that has been brewing coffee in the same shop since before the creation of the State – and on and on. There is so much about Israel that is inspirational.

I hope you will join us at CBS on Friday night, May 6 when I will speak and show pictures of my time in Israel in celebration of Yom Ha'Atzmaut. Happy Independence Day to the Israel we love — May her 68 years of existence be the foundation of many, many more.

Two years ago I was asked to be your president. Once again, another valuable lesson learned—if you trust people and work collaboratively with them, they will do their best. I have been truly humbled and amazed at the work that our fellow congregants have done for this temple. I quickly learned that people's motivation is for the good of our temple and community, and I have put that into perspective of everything we've accomplished.

Every president hopes that he/she leaves the temple a little bit better off. Hank gave me a tremendous opportunity to grow our temple, and only time will tell if I have been successful. One thing is certain; you have truly made me a better person and I have grown immensely from this experience.

People erroneously think that I am glad to give up the temple presidency. That is not true. I am leaving because my tenure is over and this temple deserves its leadership to be energized with new ideas. Make no mistake about it, I will



miss this job. I have been sincerely honored by your faith in me.

I am thankful that this temple is now in the capable hands of David Friedman. His commitment to Judaism, this temple, and our congregants makes me hopeful for the future.

An old saying states: "Motivation gets you started, habits keep you going." Motivation got me started giving back to CBS, and this habit of giving back is one that I will never break. I look forward to working with you in future projects.... whether it is your first step or 200th mile.





Donations

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- Building Fund: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/ restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- Rabbi's Discretionary Fund: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- Tree of Life: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- Yahrzeit Plaque: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.

Unless otherwise noted by you, your gift will be acknowledged in the Kibbitzer the month following its receipt. If your donation is incorrectly listed or omitted, please notify the temple office immediately.
