Jews who Like to Schmooze

I know you love to talk! At the beginning of each Shabbat service, when I ask people to take a moment to introduce themselves to those around them, I often think the *schmoozing* would go on forever if I didn't call folks back to light Shabbat candles and sing! Shabbat prayer may be the thing that gathers us together in the first place, but it's the eating and the *schmoozing* at the Oneg that helps us feel as one. The importance of talking (and even listening!) to each other is what has inspired Jeff Newman and I to initiate a series of "Community Conversations." Spearheaded by Dan Weinstein, every member of the congregation will be invited by one of our ten group leaders to participate in one of these conversations over the next two months. Jeff and I will be at each group – learning from you, listening to you, getting to know you and better understanding your hopes and dreams for CBS. This is a wonderful opportunity for you to strengthen your connections with other members of the congregation, and for us to strengthen our connection with each one of you. We look forward to *schmoozing* with you!

That's all of us too! While we may love to eat, it is increasingly difficult to sit down to eat with friends or family during the week. Yarmulkes and Prayer Books

When I was a kid, I used to collect yarmulkes. I liked having all the different colors and styles, matching them to what my mood and clothes were. I still have a collection and some of you know my obsession to match my tie color with my yarmulke (you have seen me rummaging the collection at CBS) ...after all, one must look "fly."

The yarmulke is the original ancestry.com of a temple. Any synagogue in the world tells a story of their families through the names, dates and celebrations in the inside of their kippot. It puts a time stamp on the big events of a person's life and the collective history of a temple.

Over the past 10 years, I have gotten to know many people at CBS. They have become connected to me and I have been to quite a few events of their lives. Now I also look at the inside and marvel at how a history of our temple, our families, and our collective achievements are bookmarked, timelessly inscribed on a yarmulke. The only issue is just like time itself; the commemoration wears off with time. The print fades and one's achievement is no longer recognizable.

On our 25th anniversary, you have a tremendous opportunity to bookmark your own family.

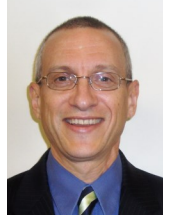

Anne Frank has long been a symbol of bravery and hope, but there were two sisters hidden in the annex, two young Jewish girls, one a cultural icon made famous by her published diary, and the other nearly forgotten.

In the spring of 1959, *The Diary of Anne Frank* has just come to the silver screen to great acclaim, and a young woman named Margie Franklin is working in Philadelphia as a secretary at a Jewish law firm. On the surface she lives a quiet life, but Margie has a secret: a life she once lived, a past and a religion she has denied, and a family and a country she left behind.

Margie Franklin is really Margot Frank, older sister of Anne, who did not die in Bergen-Belsen as reported, but who instead escaped the Nazis for America. But now, as her sister becomes a global icon, Margie's carefully constructed American life begins to fall apart. A new relationship threatens to overtake the young love that sustained her during the war, and her past and present begin to collide. Margie is forced to come to terms with Margot, with the people she loved, and with a life swept up into the course of history.

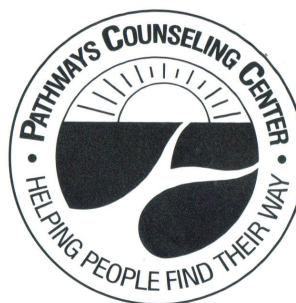

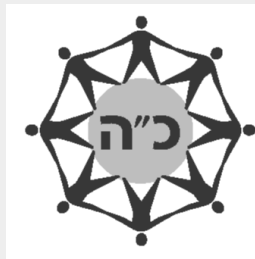

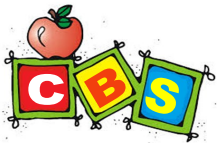

From the Heart

I have been trying to think of some creative and nurturing things that the Caring Committee can do for our community in celebration of UT25 (United Together 25). In my ponderings I came to realize a few things:



- ♦ We here at Congregation Beth Shalom are a family, and members of the global Jewish Community.
- ♦ Just like any other family, we may not always love or even like everyone the same. But when the chips are down, we are family! For example: I can talk about my sister like that, but you CANNOT!
- ♦ As members, as Jews, and as family, we will always care and come together in times of misfortune and crisis.
- ♦ We should not limit our caring to just times of crisis or sadness, but we should care always on a regular basis.

After thinking about the preceding, I came up with the following ideas and will be working with Rabbi Torop to get off the launching pad:

1. Visits to shut ins and members of our CBS family who may be hospitalized. Remember the TV show MASH? Hawkeye (Alan Alda) once said, “Loneliness is everything it’s cracked up to be.” Loneliness can foster depression and hasten death. We have at least one member who is the sole surviving member of her family. We are her family.
2. Continue to provide meals for families in times of crisis with comfort and support.
3. Institute “Shalom Phone.” Ok, so you don’t have time to go and visit, but you might be able to make a few phone calls. These calls will be made to shut ins, members who are ill, etc. A member of the team simply calls and says hello, letting them know they are in our thoughts. Wish them Shabbat Shalom! What a great way to say “We care about you, we miss you, you are still a member of our family”!
4. As we have some college age students that are away from home and thus CBS, it would be nice to have some “care packages” made up to send to them. We could include a Kibbitzer, some snacks, maybe a few “toiletries”, etc. – anything to let them know that while they are physically absent, they are still in our hearts and minds.

Any other ideas that you may have are welcome. Please be sure to let me know what activities you would like to be involved in. This is part of our heritage to heal the world.

Donations

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- **General Fund** (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- **Building Fund:** A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- **Endowment Fund:** Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- **Religious School Scholarship Fund:** These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- **Rabbi's Discretionary Fund:** a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- **Adopt-A-Book:** A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- **Bricklets:** For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life:** The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- **Yahrzeit Plaque:** To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.


