FROM THE RABBI - Rabbi Bryan Mann

Dear Congregation Beth Shalom,

This is an auspicious time for new beginnings. Aug. 11–12, was Rosh Hodesh Elul, the first of the Jewish month of Elul.



Elul immediately precedes the High Holiday season, and many see this as the time to begin the introspective work characteristic of the High Holidays. Some blow shofar every morning to invoke the sense of the High Holidays, but my favorite teaching about Elul is one of love. Rabbi Eleazar of Worms, a 12th-century rabbi from Mainz, taught the word אלול Elul is an acronym for יל אלול אלול an I'dodi v'dodi li, "I am my beloved, and my beloved is mine" (Song of Songs 6:3).

Rabbi Eleazar taught that—instead of approaching the new year with anxiety, shame, fear, or hurt—we should approach this new beginning with love. "I am my beloved and my beloved is mine." Although the Song of Songs is a book about romantic love, we can apply the lesson of "beloved" more broadly. What might it look like if we entered this new year treating ourselves, our families, our friends, our neighbors, and our synagogue community as beloved?

We are entering a time of new beginnings. I am beginning as your new senior rabbi. I come to you having served as the sole clergy for Synagogue Adas Yoshuron in Rockland, Maine, and Betenu in Amherst, New Hampshire. More recently, I served as the social justice intern at Congregation Mishkan Tefilah in Brookline, Massachusetts. Perhaps most importantly, I come to this work out of immense love. Love for prayer, ritual, teaching, studying, tikkun olam, getting to know the Jewish people around me (and their beloveds), and love for building community where all feel at home. I am honored to bring this love to the Congregation Beth Shalom family.

Thank you to Richie Bauman, our board president. Thank you to Sheila Fishman, head of the rabbinic search committee and now head of the transition team. Thank you to everyone who served on the committee, along with everyone here who took time to greet me, made me feel welcome, and provided insight into this wonderful community. In order to truly call someone beloved, one needs to get to know them. I want to meet each and every one of you (if I haven't already). I want to get to know your hopes and needs for Congregation Beth Shalom and for your own personal Jewish practice.

A little bit more about me. As you may know, tikkun olam (social justice) is a huge passion of mine. Not only were Aug. 11 and 12 Rosh Hodesh Elul, these dates also marked the first anniversary of the violent attacks that occurred in Charlottesville, Virginia. A year ago, I was in Charlottesville, alongside hundreds of clergy of various faiths to bear witness, pray, provide pastoral care, and support those confronting the resurgence of neo-Nazism and white supremacy. The Reform Movement prides itself on being a movement of tikkun olam and standing up for justice. As youth in NFTY-NE, I learned that tikkun olam is holy work. I carry this lesson into my rabbinate today.

I am also passionate about interfaith work. The Rabbinical School of Hebrew College was located directly across from Andover Newton Seminary. For the past six years, I developed lasting friendships with clergy from other faiths. These relationships provide deeper insight, love, and joy to my own Jewish practice, as well as knowledge about other faith traditions. I hope we can find way to effectively partner with faith communities around us.

When I first started getting to know this congregation, one word echoed from many of your lips: "family." Thank you for welcoming me into your Beth Shalom family. As we enter into this new beginning together, may we enter it with curiosity, commitment, and community—so that one day soon we can truly call each other beloved.




DUCATION— Sheila Fishman

<u>Join Us For The High Holy Days</u>

Shalom! As we approach the beginning of another Jewish year, we take time to reflect on the past year and how we have lived our lives as Jews. Our congregation continues to be a Jewish home for our community. As we enter 5779, we have the opportunity to consider our past, change our present, and build for the future. May the coming year be lived in a Jewish and meaningful way.

The High Holidays are always a busy time at Congregation Beth Shalom. I encourage you to attend the Selichot service and all of our High Holiday services, led by our new rabbi, Rabbi Bryan Mann, and Cantor Moshe Friedler. We will again offer our full complement of services for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, including children's/ family services for both holidays. Immediately following Yom Kippur we celebrate Sukkot, and then close the High Holiday season with our Simchat Torah celebration. Again this year we will be celebrating Sukkot Under the Stars, with special activities for our youth, who we hope, will bring a friend with them as a celebration of welcoming ushpizim (guests) as part of Sukkot.

You should be receiving your High Holiday packets in the mail, where you will find schedule/tickets. We will not be distributing lanyards this year and using the tickets as name tags, but we ask that you please bring the tickets to temple during the High Holidays for admission to services as a security measure.

The packet will also include additional in-





formation about High Holiday traditions and customs, as well as our usual materials, including information about our Tree of Life and yahrzeit plaque opportunities.

Also, for those who observe Yizkor, PLEASE remember to fill out the Book of Remembrance (BOR) form and follow the instructions for returning it. Add any new names you wish to have read as part of the service. If you had names included in the book last year, you should have had those names included with your BOR form in this year's packet. Please take a moment to check the names and spellings to ensure there are no errors (if there are, please correct and return—if there are not, please still return the form!). Copies of this form can be found on the CBS web site, the High Holiday packet, and can be obtained at the synagogue.

Finally, be sure to look at the upcoming weekly email blasts and our congregational Facebook page for special High Holiday information. If you have High Holiday questions or needs, please feel free to contact me as ritual chair at <u>sslav-</u> <u>kin50@gmail.com</u>.

DONATIONS

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- **Building Fund**: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/ restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- **Religious School Scholarship Fund:** These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- **Rabbi's Discretionary Fund**: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- Youth Group Fund: a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life**: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- **Yahrzeit Plaque**: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.
