# From the Rabbi By: Rabbi Betsy Torop

#### The Popularity of Pesach

Despite the vast changes in the nature of Jewish life and Jewish identity, Pesach remains one of the most popular Jewish holidays. Studies indicate that 7 out of 10 Jews attend a seder each year. When I ask people about their favorite holidays, Pesach and Chanukah are the most frequently mentioned. I don't think it's an accident that the holidays we favor the most – that draw us in year after year, that provide the memories that we share and pass on – tend to be those



that have the *least* to do with synagogue observance. Of course, we do celebrate these holidays at Temple with a community Seder and menorah lighting on Shabbat, but the essence of the celebrations happens with friends and family gathering together and finding their own paths, developing their own customs year after year. Pesach gives us the opportunity to interact (to learn, question and eat together), to do all of those things that help to strengthen our relationships with family, and to develop new and deeper bonds with friends. This is very different from how Shabbat worship is usually conducted, and it reminds us that the foundation of meaningful Jewish life is found in relationships with friends, family and fellow congregants. The synagogue has a role to play in helping make sure that everyone has the tools to lead a seder and that everyone has a place to go, a community of people with whom to celebrate. *If you would like to join a family for seder, or if you want tips on how to make your seder lively and meaningful, please speak to me!* 

#### **Spiritual Connection**

Many of our members and even more of those who don't have a formal affiliation tell me that they are "spiritual, but not religious." While this is a complex statement and often hard for people to fully articulate, it indicates a thirst for meaning, a desire to understand the purpose of their lives, the sense of connection to something beyond themselves. Spiritual fulfillment doesn't just happen like magic, at least for most of us. It requires cultivating and nurturing. The time between Pesach (when we celebrate the Exodus from Egypt) and Shavuot (when we celebrate the giving of Torah) is often a time used for spiritual introspection and consideration. This year, we'll spend the seven-week period from Passover to Shavuot exploring issues of spiritual growth, interpersonal relationships and character development with brief, daily online teachings drawn largely from Kabbalah on our Facebook page. First post is on April 15!

#### Memory

The same studies that show that Jews attend Pesach seders in large numbers also show that close to 75% of American Jews say that remembering the Holocaust is essential to their Jewish identity. As those who served as eyewitnesses to the horror of the Holocaust become few and fewer, the obligation of the rest of us to remember and bear witness grows ever stronger. What people mean when they say they feel an obligation to 'remember the Holocaust' is not clear – but our community provides a number of important ways to fulfill this sacred obligation. Our communal commemoration will take place on April 27 at Kol Ami, and the Beth Shalom Players will have a special presentation for Yom HaShoah on April 30. Fulfill the mitzvah of memory and join us.

This gives way to my continuing series about Teams.

What does the letter "A" represents in the word team? A is for achievement. One definition connotes final accomplishment of something noteworthy, after much effort and often in spite of obstacles and discouragements. (dictionary.com)

We all know Jews have endured numerous hardships and have overcome these challenges and have achieved great successes. Rather than focus on the past, let us focus our concentration on future achievements. Like any congregational president, I did some research on the topic. The following came from Alan M. Dershowitz, who wrote *The Vanishing American Jew*. In his book, Mr. Dershowitz proposed a series of steps that he believes we must take in order to safeguard the Jewish future, and I whole-heartily agree.

We must change the nature of American Jewish life in fundamental ways if we are to survive the new threats to our continuity as a people. These changes must make us more adaptive to the reality that we can no longer define ourselves - and our children - by reference to our past victimization and persecution. We must adopt a new, more positive Jewish identity based on tradition of education, scholarship, learning, creativity, justice, and compassion. The famed "Yiddisher cup" (khop) - Jewish head — is only half full: the typical Jewish college graduate is extraordinarily well educated about general subjects but goes through life with a kindergarten understanding of Judaism. We must begin to fill the Yiddisher cup with the kind of useful Jewish knowledge that will assure both our success and our survival.

Unless we begin to make use of our competitive advantage — as teachers, communicators, scholars, advocates, and strategists — we will lose our children and grandchildren to the seductive drift toward assimilation and away from Jewishness. The fundamental changes



we must make will require a reordering of our priorities away from an almost exclusive focus on defending Jews against external enemies and toward new ways of defending ourselves and our children against self-destruction through assimilation. We will have to educate our children differently, allocate our charitable giving differently, select our leaders differently — even define our very Jewishness differently. Jewish life will have to become less tribal, more open, more accepting of outsiders, and less defensive.

THE GREAT NEWS is that, as American Jews, we will achieve more by working together for the common goals of our people. Remember "that there is no way to get from here to there except by joining hands, marching together." Emet Ve-Emunah, Mishhkan T'Filah.

#### **Chair Yoga Classes Cancelled**



- Relocate our Garden


#### Items needed for our projects:

# MAZONA Jewish ResponseTo HungerThe Fifth Question:

#### Passover is a special time when we gather with family and friends to retell the story of our people's freedom from bondage. We read from a prayer book, perform rituals that are thousands of years old, and eat A LOT of delicious and symbolic foods. Unfortunately, not everyone is lucky enough to have that luxury.

Hunger in America is at an epidemic level. 50 million Americans – nearly 1 in 6 – struggle to put enough nutritious food on the table every day. One out of every five Israelis can't be sure when or if they'll have their next meal. These statistics are tragic, and they inspire our daily work. But at Passover, when it can seem as though the primary purpose of the Seder is to eat (and eat and eat), we feel the discomfort a bit more keenly.

We set the stage early in the Seder, saying, "All who are hungry, let them enter and eat." We move ceremoniously through the haggadah, reminding ourselves that we once were slaves in Egypt and explaining the meaning of each bite we eat. But millions of Americans and Israelis have only a lack of food, which has a very different meaning – it is a reminder that they are *still* enslaved.

#### Incorporate The Fifth Question into your Passover Seder

This year, please join Mazon as we again ask The Fifth

Question: Why on this night are millions of people still going hungry?

After the youngest person reads the four questions from the Haggadah, ask *The Fifth Question* and reflect as a group upon the crisis of hunger, why it persists and what you individually and collectively could do to end it.

Contact your elected officials to advocate on behalf of those who so desperately need our help. Organize a campaign in your community to raise awareness about hunger.

This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- **Building Fund:** A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- Rabbi's Discretionary Fund: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

#### **Opportunities:**

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- Tree of Life: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180 and stones are \$1800.
- **Yahrzeit Plaque**: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.

Unless otherwise noted by you, your gift will be acknowledged in the Kibbitzer the month following its receipt. If your donation is incorrectly listed or omitted, please notify the temple office immediately.
