#### From the Rabbi By: Rabbi Betsy Torop

#### Three Reflections from Events of Last Year – And The Questions We Ought to Still Be Asking About Them

When looking back at the past year, certain events surely stand out more than others. While the Jewish New Year turns our attention to the deep interpersonal questions that we wrestle with, the approach of a new secular year invites us to reflect on developments in America and the world at large and how we as Jews might respond. Here are three areas from the past year we might consider:



#### All People Can Love Equally

2013 was a landmark year for gay rights. Fourteen states now recognize same-sex marriage as legal, and the Supreme Court struck down parts of the Defense of Marriage Act, paving the way for married, same-sex couples to receive the same federal benefits that heterosexual couples receive. There is unfortunately no indication that Florida will reverse the state's definition of marriage as between a man and a woman. But that doesn't mean that we shouldn't be speaking out against the ongoing discrimination that gays and lesbians face and trying to make change in Florida. We can start at home. *How well do we at Beth Shalom make sure that the definition of 'family' includes all kinds of families — single, married, same -sex, interfaith, interracial? How do the pictures we show and the language we use in private and public signal to same-sex couples in particular that we are a welcoming home?* 

#### The First Yahrzeit for 20 Children and Six Adults Massacred at Newtown

December 14 will mark one year since Adam Lanza opened fire in a school in Newtown, CT, taking the lives of 26 adults and children. Despite the horror and the outcry that emerged following the horrific shooting, very little has actually changed in the year. There has been no meaningful national legislative response. The debate about guns continues as hotly as ever, pitting those who advocate more responsible background checks and limitations on the kinds of gun sold against those who believe that any such restrictions violate their Second Amendment rights and actually put the public more at risk. Stigma around those who suffer from mental illness and lack of access to reliable and effective mental health services remains shockingly poor. As we mark this first yahrzeit, how have we honored those lives lost? What should we as a faith community be doing to increase the safety of others — in the broadest sense of the word? How can we ensure that people are safe from hunger and disease, from discrimination, bullying and bodily harm? What partnerships should we form and what actions should we undertake to live up to our obligation to save life?

#### Bringing out the Best in People

None of us will forget the terrorist attack that left three dead and at least 100 wounded during the running of the Boston Marathon — a day that should have been marked only by achievement and celebration. Amongst the terrible stories of death and destruction, fear and manhunts, there were also stories of innumerable acts of kindness, strangers reaching out to strangers, Bostonians opening their homes to runners and more. These stories remind us of the goodness of humanity in the face of evil and are as much a part of the story as the death and destruction. But why does it seem that the essential goodness of human nature is most clearly demonstrated in the face of tragedy? *How can we break down barriers and divisions, reach out to others, be less suspicious of the person in need on an everyday basis? Why does it take a tragedy to unite us as Americans and as a community?* 

As we turn the page on another year, we pray that we find paths to make 2014 a year of increased equality, safety and unity.  $\square$

The synagogue is where our children and grandchildren have been taught to carry on the tradition of the Jewish religion. Finance Committee members are urged to think about the future and what the synagogue will look like many generations from now.

Continue to build upon the strong foundation that has already been set by previous generations. Perhaps it is the founders of the congregation who are setting the foundation by starting a new synagogue in the community. Planning for the future ensures that the foundation remains strong and steadfast both in a physical and spiritual sense. 

#### Education - Amy Weinstein





#### **TempleKeeping Tips: Shared Resources**

"Sharing is Caring" was what many of us were taught as early as we can remember; and we continue to set that example and teach those same lessons to our children. Here at CBS, we share a lot of our time and our resources to make our temple a warm, inviting, and exciting Templekeeping Tips place to be!



As we continue to share what the temple has to offer, it's important to care about all of the other activities and groups that may be using those same resources, and care about the items we use so they can last a long time and be available to everyone when needed.

The Buildings & Grounds committee will be developing a Storage Area plan so that everyone will have a clear understanding of where things belong, but until then, an easy rule of thumb would be to simply put things back in the same place as they were found. Our new storage room is a great space, and can fit everything that's in there....when it's placed back correctly.

Here's a quick list on how some of our most shared items should be stored if you need to use them:

Tables: The long, 8 foot tables should be placed upright on their short end just to right of the entrance to the storage room.

Tables: Our 6 foot banquet style tables (both wide and narrow widths) should be stored on their long side on the cart directly in front of you when entering the storage room.

Tables: Our 4 large rounds and 1 small round should be stored on the diagonally placed cart in the right corner of the area. Please do not roll these tables, as tempting as it is. They are not built to withstand that pressure, and we've had to dispose of a few of them that have buckled from that type of handling. The entire cart can be rolled to place the tables.

Chairs: The temple has 72 folding chairs. Our chair rack holds 50 when stacked appropriately. Chairs should be stacked no more than 10 high for safety reasons, and 2 sit adjacent to the rack.

Chairs: Sanctuary chairs should never be stacked as it causes too much wear and tear on the upholstery.

#### PLEASE BRING EMPTY PRINTER CARTRIDGES TO THE SYNAGOGUE AND PLACE THEM IN THE LARGE BOX AT THE SIDE ENTRANCE

If you have a business (or work with one), you can still order boxes for the business and recycle empty print cartridges directly at the business without bringing them to the synagogue.

#### To order free boxes for business recycling:

Go to http://recycleyourempties.com. Click on "Get Started."

On the log in page, skip down and click on "Create Account."

Fill out the registration form for the business. Pick "charity." Then pick CBS.

After you register, log in to your account to order boxes to collect your empties.

Encourage others (associates, customers, patients, etc.) to use the box.

When your box is full, log in to your account to print postage-paid mailing labels. Affix the labels and mail the box. Congregation Beth Shalom will get credit for your donation.


