Shabbat Services Are . . .

How would you – honestly – fill in the blank? Communal worship is hard. It is the balancing act between the needs of the individual, the pull of tradition, and the power and bonds of community. The noted contemporary theologian Abraham Joshua Heschel explained it this way: "It is true that a Jew never worships as an isolated individual but



as part of the Community of Israel. Yet, it is within the heart of every individual that prayer takes place. It is a personal duty, and an intimate act which cannot be delegated to either the [rabbi] or to the whole community. We pray with all of Israel and every one of us by himself (sic)."

We all come to services for different reasons — the opportunity to be with others, a sense of obligation, the chance for peace and quiet, the words of prayer themselves. Whether or not the service "meets our needs" depends, of course, on what our needs are in the first place. For every individual who tells me she finds comfort in the familiar repetition of the same words and melodies from week to week, there is another person who expresses the need for change and novelty, new words and melodies to elevate the spirit. Some say the sameness is boring; others find it comforting. There are those who say that the presence of community is all that really matters, and there are those who find the seeming obligation to chat and talk counterproductive to their spiritual needs. Some find deep connection to the ancient Hebrew words; others find them unfamiliar and distancing. And, we all bring in our own "stuff" from the week that has passed — the events and words and challenges that may either distract us from prayer or cause us to be even more open to the words of the prayer book and the melodies of prayer.

I share your concerns and struggles with communal worship. Sometimes the familiar words resonate; other times, they seem merely rote. Sometimes the events of the week are hard to put aside. Sometimes individual needs are reinforced and embraced by the community; other times, I feel out of step. Weekly worship doesn't just happen, and creating prayer that is meaningful (for the community and each individual) is a journey that we take together.

These are the things I think about week after week as I plan services, review melodies with Sandy, decide whether to add readings or stories, and consider what to speak about in a sermon. The ritual committee, too, has been discussing these questions in regard to Shabbat morning services in particular. Erev Shabbat services are traditionally different in many respects from Shabbat morning services, and this is very true at Beth Shalom. Our Shabbat morning services are more intimate and informal. We have used them as an opportunity to conduct learning services, have conversations, introduce new melodies and explore spiritual tools such as meditation.

Heschel teaches, "There is a permanent union between individual worship and communal worship, each of which depends for its existence upon the other." *Shabbat services are...* I'd like to hear your answer. Your honest feedback, reflections, input and suggestions will help direct our journey, as individuals and as a community. \Box

This passage from the *Mishkan TFilah* teaches us that life can sometimes be difficult. More importantly, it teaches us to join forces when striving to overcome adversities. The Union for Reform Judaism (URJ) offers tools to learn from experts in a variety of fields, to ask big questions, share ideas and best principles, and apply lessons to our congregation resulting in positive congregational change.

The CBS mission statement includes the goal of joining together: "Affirming the collective importance of contributing to the ongoing well-being of the communities in which we live."

Teamwork can and should be part of everyday Jewish life. You can accomplish this by working on the next fundraising event, putting together the next adult education class, or helping with one of the many aspects of Shabbat services. Together Everyone Achieves More!



The Seven Stages of Creation: Religion meets the Big Bang

Sunday Feb. 2, 4 p.m.

Every religion has its "creation" story, and many who believe those stories literally reject the modern scientific view of the "big bang." This conflict has become intense, affecting political discourse, school curricula, and church-state separation. Even those who accept the big bang model of the universe often have only a fuzzy idea of what it is and why scientists accept it. In this talk, Dr. Will describes the current model of big bang cosmology and will provide currently accepted best answers to questions like "How old is the universe?" and "Will it expand forever?" Dr. Will also describes the essential differences between how science and religion work.

Dr. Clifford Will is the Distinguished Professor of Physics at the University of Florida. He is a Fellow of the American Physical Society and a member of the US National Academy of Sciences.

Memorialize your loved one with a Yahrzeit Plaque to be cared for in perpetuity. The plaque includes the common date and Hebrew date of death. Their plaque will be lit on the corresponding week of the anniversary of their passing.



Donations

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- Building Fund: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- Rabbi's Discretionary Fund: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example – Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note, otherwise your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a
 card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent
 to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her
 name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- Tree of Life: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180 and stones are \$1800.
- Yahrzeit Plaque: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.

Unless otherwise noted by you, your gift will be acknowledged in the Kibbitzer the month following its receipt.
