From the Rabbi By: Rabbi Betsy Torop

Scholar-In-Residence Rabbi Mark Glickman: Sacred Treasures, Hidden Texts, and Massive Heaps of Words: Adventures in the Discovery of Lost Jewish Writings.

Four years ago we dedicated a *genizah* (a repository for sacred texts) at Beth Shalom. We gathered together all of those books and materials that contained God's sacred name and that were no longer in use or had fallen into disrepair, and we buried them with reverence.

We continue to collect materials (papers from study sessions, prayer books that have fallen apart, sacred texts that are donated to us), and one day we will open our *genizah* again and bury a new collection of material.

If the material was to be preserved and discovered hundreds of years in the future, what conclusions would be drawn about us? What would they learn from our Torah study sheets, from generations of Reform prayer books and *haggadot*, from copies of Torah texts used by *b'nai mitzvah* students? In burying these sacred texts, it is unlikely they will actually remain intact, but that is not always the case with *genizahs*.

The most famous *genizah* in the world was located in the attic of the Cairo synagogue. The documents were remarkably preserved and the wealth of material found within it provides an amazing glimpse into the daily lives of Jews who lived hundreds of years ago. Rabbi Mark Glickman, along with his teenage son, was the first person in one hundred years to look into the Cario *Genizah*, and the first person ever to photograph the interior. Rabbi Glickman tells the story of the *Genizah* in his book, *Sacred Treasure – the Cairo Genizah: The Amazing Discoveries of Forgotten Jewish History in an Egyptian Synagogue Attic*. Described as "Indiana Jones meets *The DaVinci Code* in an old Egyptian Synagogue," Rabbi Glickman will tell his story of discovery and share remarkable insights about the Cairo *Genizah* as our Scholar-in-Residence on the weekend of October 25-26. In partnership with the Tampa Federation Jewish Book Festival, Rabbi Glickman will speak about his book on Saturday night at CBS. On Friday night, he will speak about his new work, *Burnt Pearls: The Rise, Fall, and Redemption of the Nazi Jewish Library*, exploring the many volumes of Judaica that were both looted and preserved by the Nazis.

In a famous ethical will, written in the twelfth-century by Judah Ibn Tibbon to his son, Samuel , he writes, "Let books be your companions; let bookcases and shelves be your pleasure ground and gardens. Bask in their paradise, gather their fruit, pluck their roses, enjoy their spices and their myrrh. If your soul be sated and weary, change from garden to garden, from furrow to furrow, from prospect to prospect." Ibn Tibbon speaks not only for himself, but for many of us, and certainly for the Jewish people. We are a people dedicated to books, to words, to sacred texts. That dedication is at the heart of our 2013 Scholar-in-Residence program; you won't want to miss it...

VIII. You Shall Determine the Appropriate Time for a Capital Campaign

The more righteous charity, the more peace. Pirke Avot 2:7

A capital campaign can help us stay financially healthy and keep our buildings healthy. The campaign can be designed to raise money to restore our facilities or build a new structure. It can be used to develop additional programs important to our synagogue or to raise funds to start an endowment. It is important that the campaign is organized and well run so that in the end the campaign will be a success. When planning a capital campaign the mission, vision and goals of our synagogue are an integral part of the planning process.

A Capital Campaign is a major undertaking for our synagogue whether it is large or small, but in the end the hard work will pay off. Members will see a new beautiful building as the result of the hard work put into fundraising or perhaps an endowment that will keep the synagogue financially stable and healthy for many years to come.

One of the most difficult aspects of this type of campaign is getting the campaign off the ground. How do we start? When do we start? How do we ask our members for support? Answers to these



questions differ from synagogue to synagogue. Discussing these questions among our staff and the congregants and developing a vision is as important as the campaign itself. Good branding and marketing can help to ensure a successful campaign. The Union for Reform Judaism has developed a publication which helps synagogues to start a Capital Campaign. It offers basic ideas to initiate the campaign and helps answer some of the questions regarding these campaigns.

In closing, I wanted to give an update to you on the status for the High Holy Day Campaign. As of September 19, a total of 36 congregants have generously given nearly \$20,000 towards the betterment of Congregation Beth Shalom. Remember, our goal is to have all 155 families put forth a significant and meaningful donation. We still have a ways to go until we have 100 percent participation; however I know we will exceed this year's goals!




