A New History of the Holy Days

The ancient rabbis were very creative (to say the least) in their understanding of time. As they understood the history of the world, Moses ascended Mt. Sinai to plead for the Children of Israel after the Golden Calf on the first day of Elul (the month preceding Rosh Hashanah). God finally agrees to grant forgiveness on Yom Kippur. In his book *60 Days: A Spiritual Guide to the High*



Holydays, Simon Jacobson writes, "Essentially this cycle is the story of love, betrayal and reconciliation... In *Elul*, Moses succeeds to have God consider the proposition (of relationship after the Golden Calf), on Rosh Hashanah, God finally agrees to recommit. Yom Kippur is the wedding ceremony. We then dance and sing in the wedding celebration on Sukkot, followed by a final burst of ultimate joy on Simchat Torah."

Creative history, to be sure. But it's reflective of a pattern we know in our own lives. The process of letting someone down, seeking reconciliation, asking for forgiveness and then moving again toward a healthy relationship is one we can all understand. If we have had a falling out with an old friend, we consider; we wrestle; we try to make it right. We seek forgiveness, but to repair the relationship we have to begin to spend time together again — to share birthdays, dinners, special celebrations. Those celebrations are key in our personal relationships and in our relationships with God and Jewish life. So why is it that we tend to ignore the celebration, the joy that immediately follows Yom Kippur?

Convenience vs. Commitment?

Sukkot and Simchat Torah seem less important to us than Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, the joy and celebration following our reconciliation with others and with God less essential than the act of reconciliation and repentance itself. But clearly there is more to it. We've already taken days off work for the 'major Holy Days,' missed school assignments and homework, rescheduled lessons and doctor appointments. Sukkot and Simchat Torah are often midweek (this year on Wednesday nights), and it's hard to get to Temple from work, hard to have another late night mid-week, hard to have to juggle yet again. But, like anything from exercising to studying to dieting, most of us could do it. It may not be easy or convenient, but we could do it. And I promise you, your commitment will be richly rewarded and spiritually fulfilling. See the stars through the Sukkah, join your friends in a potluck dinner, or bring your kids to our wonderful new "Sukkah under the Stars" with hay rides, square dancing and a focus on the hospitality of Sukkot by encouraging kids to bring a friend. Hear wonderful live Jewish music on Simchat Torah, hug our sacred torah close as you dance with friends, and see the masterpiece that is a torah scroll unrolled.

If you are looking to put your commitments for a New Year into practice, start by making the commitment to celebrate joy and join us for Sukkot and Simchat Torah.

Michael, Gideon, Aaron and Hannah join me in wishing all of you a *Shanah Tovah u'Metukah* — a year of sweetness, fulfillment and joy. \Box

This month's article is Part Seven in a series of ten communicating the Ten Financial Commandments. These Commandments provide guidance to allow all of us to celebrate simchahs and all of our life-cycle events and from which we can receive support when needed.

VII. You Shall Have Financial Controls

Let your friend's property be as dear to you as your own. -Pirke Avot 2:12

Ensuring that synagogues have financial controls to protect their financial viability is extremely important. We may not consider that things like misappropriation could happen in a synagogue, but unfortunately they sometimes do. So, like for-profit companies, synagogues should have controls in place to ensure that their funds are kept safe and that the individuals responsible for those funds have protections in place to limit the likelihood of impropriety.

A carpenter needs a tool belt with a hammer, nails and a level; and a doctor needs his stethoscope and tongue depressor. So too, a synagogue needs its tools to help meet the financial goals of being financially healthy so that it can prosper and meet the needs of its congregation. Without correct tools, the carpenter can't build a house, and the doctor can't examine and diagnose his patients. Without financial tools, synagogues can't meet their financial goals. One such tool is the investment policy statement,

which is currently under review by the finance committee.

Please complete the enclosed registration form with your deposit check, and we'll reserve your space. Registration forms may be left in the administrator's mailbox or mailed to the synagogue.



Why Pomegranates on Rosh Hashanah?

Pomegranates aren't a new fruit; after all, they are referenced in the

Torah. In Hebrew, the pomegranate is called rimon (also the word for a hand grenade!).

What makes this delicious, beautiful and healthy food especially meaningful during Rosh Hashanah? On the second night of Rosh Hashanah, when it is customary to eat a 'new fruit' that has not been eaten during the year, many Jews choose the pomegranate. Now available year around in some stores, the pomegranate is truly in season September through February in the Northern hemisphere, making it ideal as a 'new fruit.'

Secondly, pomegranates supposedly contain 613 seeds. Thus, Jews display their desire to fulfill God's 613 mitzvot (commandments from the Torah) by eating the pomegranate.

Pomegranate Apple Bread



Combine apple and poms in one delicious bite! Apples inside make the bread very moist and sweet, and pomegranate seeds lend pops of color throughout. (From Kirby's Cravings Food Blog.)

Ingredients

3 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 tsp salt

1 Tbsp baking powder

1 tsp cinnamon

1/2 tsp ground allspice

1 pinch ground cloves

1 generous pinch fresh ground nutmeg

3/4 cup sugar

1/4 cup brown sugar

2 eggs

1/4 cup melted unsalted butter

1 1/4 cup milk

1/4 cup unsweetened apple-

1 cup finely diced apples

1 cup pomegranate arils



Directions

- Mix all of the dry ingredients.
- 2. Melt the butter by microwaving it for about 30-40 seconds. Mix the melted butter with the applesauce to cool it down. Beat the eggs and milk together. Beat the applesauce/butter mixture into the egg/milk mixture.
- 3. Pour the wet mixture, the apples and the pomegranate arils into the dry ingredients and stir until just blended. Once all of the dry ingredients are wet, stop mixing, even if there are a few clumps left. If you overmix the dough, the bread will come out tough.
- 4. Pour mixture into two 9×5 bread tins that have either been greased or lined with foil. Bake at 350°F for 50 minutes until inside comes out clean with a knife. [Using smaller baking pans may result in rising, and shorter cooking time.]
- Cool on a rack for 10 minutes before removing from the pan.




