FROM THE RABBI - Rabbi Bryan Mann

Purim: Making Space For Our Full Selves

My friend Hayley has a philosophy about Purim costumes, "It's not all fun and games" she says. "A Purim costume should be an embodiment of some part of yourself that you feel there is no room for the rest of the year, either you don't make room, or the world doesn't make room, or for some reason it doesn't fit into your life. It can be 'coming out' of sorts that is extremely liberating."



When I think of the most profound Purim costumes I have seen over the years there are a few that come to mind. Two people who were often walking in the world with very warm, welcoming, effervescent personalities who dressed in all black and refused to interact with many people. Making space and giving voice to their struggles with depression few of us knew about prior to Purim that year. Someone going through a divorce who wore her wedding dress on Purim. Using the humor and revelry of Purim to help her find any semblance of joy during a painful situation. Someone dressed as "Miss Prounouned" wearing on their body all of the pronouns people mistakenly used for them throughout the year. Once again, using humor to bring attention to and help find humor in a painful regular experience from them.

So often, when we think of Purim we think of our youth and the characters of the Purim story. Who is going to dress up as Queen Esther? As Mordechai? As Haman? As Vashti? As King Ahasuerus? The adults among us might recycle what we dressed up as for Halloween if we dress up at all. One of the messages of the Purim story however is, "Take off the mask." Esther is able to save the Jewish people only because she reveals her hidden identity as a Jew.

As my friend Hayley points out, sometimes we do not make room for parts of ourselves. We do not want to fully face the depression we feel. Fully face the pain of a divorce. Have the long-involved conversations around what our actual pronouns are and why the matter. We may choose to hide aspects of ourselves from friends, family, and the community for our own emotional, physical, financial safety.

Other times, the world or communities we live in make it unsafe for us to bring our full selves to the table. After all, there is still a huge stigma around seeking therapy and help for depression, as well as other mental health stuff. Societal messages around divorce often present it as a "failure" making it hard to talk about. Those in the LGBTQ+ community are still physically attacked just for being ourselves in public and still face discrimination when it comes to employment, housing, adoption, healthcare, and other aspects of society. Sometimes we do not reveal our full selves because something about the world around us or our communities feels unsafe to do so.

Purim makes demands on our community spaces to be safe enough for just one day for people to bring their full selves to the table. Without fear. Without judgement. A chance for us to truly see what others are going through. Purim makes demands on us as individuals saying, "Do not hide. Do not shy away from this. For just one day, show it to the world. Let it out." If this is done well Purim can be extremely freeing.







Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- Building Fund: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- Rabbi's Discretionary Fund: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- Youth Group Fund: a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- Tree of Life: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- Yahrzeit Plaque: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.

Unless otherwise noted by you, your gift will be acknowledged in The Kibbitzer the month following its receipt. If your donation is incorrectly listed or omitted, please notify the temple office immediately.
