FROM THE RABBI - Rabbi Bryan Mann

Av: The Month of Despair, The Month of Love

The Hebrew month of Av begins Thursday, August 1, at sundown. Av is known as one of the saddest months of the year. Tisha b'Av, the 9th of Av (which this year coincides with Aug. 10th and 11th) is a fast day that commemorates the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem. The rabbis of the Talmud teach us the Temple in Jerusalem was destroyed because of שינה דינום baseless hatred (Yoma 9b). We lost our spiritual home, our place of ancient Jewish practice; the place where some felt most connected to the Divine was destroyed because we were so filled with hate.



The ninth of Av is spent fasting, reflecting on the destruction of the Temple by reading איכה Eicha, the book of Lamentation, and reflecting on other Jewish tragedies.

A short six days later (Aug. 17th and 18th) is Tu b'Av, the 15th of Av, the Jewish day of love. Mishna Taanit 4:8, the earliest mention of Tu b'Av in our tradition teaches, "Rabbi Shimon ben Gamaliel said: There were no days of joy in Israel greater than the 15th of Av and Yom Kippur. On these days the daughters of Jerusalem would go out in borrowed white garments in order not to shame anyone who had none. All these garments required immersion. The daughters of Jerusalem come out and dance in the vineyards. What would they say? Young man, lift up your eyes and see what you choose for yourself. Do not set your eyes on beauty but set your eyes on the family. "Grace is deceitful, and beauty is vain, but a woman that fears the Lord, she shall be praised" (Proverbs 31:30). And it further says, "Give her of the fruit of her hands; and let her works praise her in the gates" (ibid, 31:31).

In Ancient times, Tu b'Av was a day of matchmaking, dancing, joy, and revelry. In modern times, some Jews celebrate this day as a Jewish Valentine's Day of sorts. It is most commonly celebrated in Israel and is slowly getting celebrated by Jews all over the world.

The month of Av begins by inviting us to lean into our despair. Whether it is the sadness and tragedy of losing our first spiritual home or the sadness and tragedy of more modern tragedies we as Jews face: shootings in synagogues, the resurgence of Neo-Nazism and white supremacy, witnessing similar tragedies our ancestors faced happening again to other minority populations... Tisha b'Av tells us to lean into the feelings of fear, grief, despair.

Tu b'Av tells us, "But you cannot stay there. Even in this month of despair and tragedy there is still love." Perhaps even more so in a month where we lean into our grief and despair, a month that reminds us baseless hatred still exists in the world, we need a reminder that love also exists. We need a day to dance and celebrate love.

In this month of Av let us learn from these holidays. Let us recognize the baseless hatred that exists in our world, the baseless hatred we might carry in our hearts knowingly or unknowingly, and begin to productively move through it. Let us recognize our internal and external worlds are not just filled with hate. That there is love, love that deserves to be amplified, celebrated, and danced to. Hodesh Tov (Happy month)!

Retreat Takeaways and A Special Thank You

I would like thank all members who attended the synagogue's first ever membership-wide retreat. We had both members and nonmembers present. We reviewed where we currently are and where we need to move. Over the past two years, we have lost 42 members/families and that has had a significant impact on us. Members present at the retreat and the board recognize certain things need to change. A number of attendees made suggestions and provided input the board will address over the next few months. These items include a review of what membership means, dues, programming, religious school to just name a few of the areas to be addressed.

As for adult education, the rabbi is putting together two separate programs. First, each month the rabbi will be have at least one adult education program directed to our texts, the Torah, Talmud, Midrash, Kabbalah and other relevant writings. In addition, each month the rabbi will be offering a lighter and more fundamental program relating the fundamentals of Judaism and how it applies in our current lives. We have yet to name the program, but expect it to cover issues such as interfaith marriage, fundamentals of a Shabbat service, etc. We expect to open both programs to members and nonmembers.

High Holidays are approaching and as they approach, the board has again discussed how to handle services to non-members, including family members of members. As a change from the past, this year the board has voted to open services to any Jewish person who would like to attend, at no cost. By offering the services at no cost, the board believes we are working to fulfill our obligation to the broader Jewish community and ensuring that Congregation Beth Shalom remains the center of Jewish life in Brandon. Notwithstanding, we certainly appreciate any donations non-members are willing to make.

Many have asked about the roof and the tarp on it. We are working to repair the roof and have a claim with our insurance company as a result of damage caused to the roof as a result of the storm last year. The claim was initially denied

Even if we reach a resolution with our insurance company, between the deductible and potential attorney's fees, whatever amount received will not be enough to cover the full amount of replacement. The congregation will have to come out of pocket for a large portion of the expense. We appreciate everyone's patience as we resolve this issue.

coffee, bagels, and camaraderie. Everyone is invited to attend.



Religious School Registration

Join us at the Open House on Sunday, Aug. 4, from 9:30 a.m. until noon. This will be the time to learn about our evolving religious school. Our classes are designed to meet the educational needs of children kindergarten through Confirmation. We are continuing our cutting-edge religious school curriculum which has been specifically developed for Congregation Beth Shalom. We offer classes on:

- The religious holidays with special hands-on programs
- Jewish history from the Biblical period to the present
- Our Great Biblical leaders
- Jewish values allowing them to become righteous adults capable of making good decisions

Our once-a-week program begins Sunday, Aug. 18. For kindergarten and 1st grade, children will be meeting for 18 sessions during the school year. A calendar of classes will be available at the open house. For grades 2 through 7, school hours continue to be 9:30 a.m. until noon. Our day begins with a worship service at 9:30 a.m., followed by a one-hour Hebrew class and one-hour Judaica class.

The religious school fees are as follows:

- For kindergarten and 1st grade, the fee is \$200 for the year with an early bird rate of \$175 if you pay in full by Aug. 4.
- For grades 2-7, the fee is \$325. However, we are offering an early bird price of \$300 if you pay in full no later than Aug. 4.

L'Dor Vador

In catering to the needs of our diverse community, we are introducing a new program we refer to as "L'Dor Vador" for students age 11 - 16 who have not been Bar or Bat Mitzvah. These students will be meeting during regular religious school hours. With the final nine months of the program, the students will also be attending private tutoring to specifically prepare for their B'Nai Mitzvah. - Worship service attendance: A student must attend a minimum of ten services from Aug. 18, through May 3, 2020, to be recognized. That translates to one service per month.
- **Religious school attendance:** A student must attend 100% of the religious school classes from Aug. 18, through May 3, 2020, for their grade level.
- Outstanding mitzvah award: An award will be given to one student in each class who regularly performs a mitzvah for a member of their Jewish or non-Jewish community.

Examples include:

- ☐ The student can be visiting an individual in a nursing home on a regular basis.
- ☐ The student is helping with a community-wide clean-up program.
- \Box The student is sending cards and pictures to a military person.
- ☐ It cannot include performing routine chores assigned by parents or caring for a family pet.
- □ A parent must submit a letter of recommendation to the religious school by May 3, 2020, describing the student's mitzvah.


This cookbook will be compiled with pictures and be produced professionally; we are projecting a November deadline. Hopefully it will become a treasured book for everyone.

Monday, Sept. 16, at 6 p.m., Page Turners will once again meet. We will be discussing *The Weight of Ink*, by Rachel Kadish.

Set in London of the 1660s and of the early 21st century, *The Weight of Ink* is the interwoven tale of two women of remarkable intellect: Ester Velasquez, an emigrant from Amsterdam who is permitted to scribe for a blind rabbi, just before the plague hits the city; and Helen Watt, an ailing historian with a love of



Jewish history. As the novel opens, Helen has been summoned by a former student to view a cache of 17th-century Jewish documents newly discovered in his home during a renovation. Enlisting the help of Aaron Levy, an American graduate student as impatient as he is charming, and in a race with another fast-moving team of historians, Helen embarks on one last project: to determine the identity of the documents' scribe, the elusive "Aleph." Electrifying and ambitious, sweeping in scope and intimate in tone, *The Weight of Ink* is a sophisticated work of historical fiction about women separated by centuries and the choices and sacrifices they must make in order reconcile the life of the heart and mind.

This book became a USA Today Bestseller. It was the winner of a National Jewish Book Award, winner of the Association of Jewish Libraries Jewish Fiction Award, an Amazon Best Book of the Year, one of Ms. Magazine's "Bookmark" titles, and one of The Jewish Exponent's "2017's Top Reads."

DONATIONS

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- Building Fund: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- Rabbi's Discretionary Fund: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- Youth Group Fund: a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- Tree of Life: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- Yahrzeit Plaque: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$350. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.
