This month is seen as a month of spiritual preparation for the High Holidays. There are many ways Bryan Mann 681-6547 one could do this. A cry. A prayer beyond words. As Rabbi Art Green writes in his book, *Seek My Face*: Toby Koch 654-0877 The dream of restored wholeness is sounded out dramatically by the shofar 3rd VP: Beit Kehillat blasts, the central symbolic expression of the teshuva season. The shofar **House of Community** represents prayer beyond words, an intensity of longing that can be articulated open only in a wordless shout. But the order of the sounds, according to one old interpretation, contains the message in quite explicit terms. Each series of Treasurer shofar blasts begins with teki'ah, a whole sound. It is followed by shevarim, a tripartite broken sound whose very name means "breakings." "I started off whole," the shofar speech says, "and I became broken." Then follows teru'ah, a Allan Weber 867-885-4806 staccato series of blast fragments saying: "I was entirely smashed to pieces." But each series has to end with a new tekiah, promising wholeness once more. The Secretary Sheila Fishman 833-7843 shofar cries out a hundred times ... I was whole, I was broken, even smashed to bits, but I shall be whole again!" 
This year we again have an generous anonymous donor who will match new and increased under the same terms as last year.





• And learning of our Jewish values allowing them to become righteous adults capable of making good decisions.

#### **Religious School Incentive Program**

We have instituted an incentive program for all students. We will be recognizing students in three areas.

• Worship Service Attendance: A student must attend a minimum of ten services from Aug. 18, through May 3, 2020 to be recognized. That translate to one service per month.

• Religious School Attendance: A student must attend 100% of religious school classes from Aug. 18, through May 3, 2020 for their grade level.

• Outstanding Mitzvah Award: An award will be given to one student in each class who regularly performs a mitzvah for a member of their Jewish or non-Jewish community.

At the end of year school program May 17, 2020, awards and gift cards will be given out to students in the above categories.

#### Chai 2 Program

We have implemented this program for young families with preschool age children (ages 3-5) to maintain a family membership at a savings of 80% of our family dues. This translates to \$360 annually. This amount will stay in place until such time as the family's youngest child reaches school age or approximately 6 years old. We are also offering an incentive to these families for these young students for the next year. Please share this information with family and friends.

#### L'Dor Vador

In catering to the needs of our diverse community, we introduced a new program we refer to as "L'Dor Vador" for students age 11 - 16 who have not been a Bar or Bat Mitzvah. It is our goal to pass on our traditions from generation to generation. This will be a special 2-year program culminating with the b'nai mitzvah. These students will be meeting during regular religious school hours. With the final 9 months of the program, the students will also be attending private tutoring to specifically prepare for their b'nai mitzvah. Attendance in this program requires membership at Congregation Beth Shalom. Please share this information with family and friends.



Monday, Sept. 16, at 6 p.m., Page Turners will once again meet. We will be discussing *The Weight of Ink* by Rachel Kadish.

Set in London of the 1660s and of the early 21st century, *The Weight of Ink* is the interwoven tale of two women of remarkable intellect: Ester Velasquez, an emigrant from Amsterdam who is permitted to scribe for a blind rabbi, just before the plague hits the city; and Helen Watt, an ailing historian with a love of Jewish history. As the novel opens, Helen has been summoned by a former student to

view a cache of 17th-century Jewish documents newly discovered in his home during a renovation. Enlisting the help of Aaron Levy, an American graduate student as impatient as he is charming, and in a race with another fastmoving team of historians, Helen embarks on one last project: to determine the identity of the documents' scribe, the elusive "Aleph." Electrifying and ambitious, sweeping in scope and intimate in tone, *The Weight of Ink* is a so-



phisticated work of historical fiction about women separated by centuries and the choices and sacrifices they must make in order reconcile the life of the heart and mind.

This book became *a USA Today* bestseller. It was winner of a National Jewish Book Award, winner of the Association of Jewish Libraries Jewish Fiction Award, an Amazon Best Book of the Year, one of Ms. Magazine's "Bookmark" titles, and one of The Jewish Exponent's "2017's Top Reads."

Rachel Kadish, is the author, most recently, of the novel *Tolstoy Lied: A Love Story*. Among her many honors are a Koret Award, a Pushcart Prize, and citations in the 1997 and 2003 editions of The Best American Short Stories. Her work has been published in *Zoetrope: All-Story, Tin House, Story, Bomb, Moment, Sh'ma, Congress Monthly,* and *Lilith.* Kadish, a graduate of Princeton University, earned her M.A. in fiction writing at New York University. She lives in Newtonville, Massachusetts.

#### DONATIONS

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

#### Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- **Building Fund**: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/ restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- **Religious School Scholarship Fund:** These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- **Rabbi's Discretionary Fund:** a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- Youth Group Fund: a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

#### **Opportunities:**

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.


