FROM THE RABBI - Rabbi Paul Schreiber, Reb Tuviah

Expressing Thanks ... It's So Jewish!

Thanksgiving, the idea and the holiday, are both very much on my mind this year. It is interesting to note certain segments within the Jewish community in our country that do not observe or celebrate Thanksgiving. People in these groups go about their lives as if Thanksgiving is an ordinary Thursday. Their schools and shops are open, doing business as usual. They believe Thanksgiving is not a Jewish holiday and, therefore, has no claim upon them.



We know, however, giving thanks is a very religious value and is most certainly a Jewish value if not a Jewish holiday. I submit that giving thanks and expressing gratitude are among the most, if not *the* most, of all human and religious values. Such expressions appear on almost on every page of our Siddur, our prayer book. I understand the holiday of Sukkot is our own institutionalized Thanksgiving. However, if you are an American, enjoying America's freedom and blessings, why ignore an American holiday, especially if it does not negate Judaism and requires no violation or suspension of Jewish law?

In my family, we always look forward to Thanksgiving with great anticipation. Family members from far and wide make their way to one central location on Long Island and, for one day, catch up on each other's lives. Although many family members have passed on, we still gather each year, pausing to remember them as we celebrate our family and give thanks for all that we have.

One of our sages, Rabbi Meir, taught that in gratitude one should recite a hundred blessings every day. Even on the most ordinary and uneventful of days, there are countless occasions for expressions of gratitude. Beyond those of home, family, food, and shelter, there are so many gifts that call forth a blessing. There are moments and sights that could and should be sanctified with a bracha. These may include the magic of a melody that captures the heart, an idea that exalts the mind, a stately tree that excites the imagination, a formation of migrating birds, a rainfall that refreshes, a congenial conversation, autumn leaves, the reawakening of nature every spring, the sudden appearance of a magical rainbow, and the freedom to which we awaken every day. These and so many others are gifts and moments to treasure. Indeed, the quality of our lives is reflected by the things that move us to recite a bracha. To celebrate Thanksgiving is to celebrate life.

Nancy and I wish all of our Congregation Beth Shalom members and friends a joyous Thanksgiving!

Monday, Nov. 16, at 6 p.m., Page Turners will meet in a Zoom session for a discussion of Mary Morris's book *Gateway to the Moon*. In her book she weaves together the contemporary story of Miguel Torres, a young man desperately trying to escape an impoverished New Mexico town, with the tales of his ancestors' long journey from Spain. Tracing back to the expulsion of Jews and Muslims in 1492, this novel tells the story of the Jews who held on to their heritage despite the family rupture and torture they endured and poses questions about what connects and claims us.

While this is a work of fiction, there is an historical basis for the story. It touches on the expulsion of the Jews from Spain, the Inquisition, and the settlement of Crypto-Jews

in New Mexico. There is so much going on in this book besides the historical back story. There is the growth of young Miguel and relationship with his employer, Rachel Rothstein. While reading the book, I actually felt like I was in contemporary New Mexico. This was one of those "I cannot put this book down" books.

Giving Thanks Dinner


Since our High Holy day Food Drive was successful, social action is reaching out to our members who are under financial stress to see if they would like some food toward Thanksgiving.

Free Holocaust Survivor Presentation and Q&A

Wednesday, Dec. 2, at 6:30 p.m., The Florida Holocaust Museum and the Hillsborough County Public Library Cooperative will host a virtual program with Holocaust survivor Marie Silverman. Marie will will tell her story, which includes her life in hiding, internment, escape, and emigration. The talk will be followed by audience Q&A.

Marie Silverman (née Berkovic): Marie was born in 1931 and lived with her sister Jeannette and their parents in Antwerp, Belgium when World War II began. After Germany invaded Belgium, the family escaped to France. For a while, non-Jews hid them on a farm, but when the roundups began, the family was captured and separated: the sisters with their mother were placed in an internment camp at Rivesaltes, France, while their father was sent to a different camp. After nine months, Marie's and Jeannette's mother managed to smuggle her daughters out of Rivesaltes. They were hiding with other refugees in Vence, France. They were then briefly reunited with the parents who managed to escape, but the father soon died as a result of the



mistreatment he had endured in the camp. Two partisan couriers took the sisters across the Pyrénées Mountains on foot from Vence to Barcelona, Spain. Marie and Jeannette lived with their aunt and uncle and then came to the United States. Once here, they were placed in an orphanage and with foster families until their mother was able to reunite with them in 1949.



DONATIONS

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- Building Fund: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/ restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- **Religious School Scholarship Fund:** These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- **Rabbi's Discretionary Fund**: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- Youth Group Fund: a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life**: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- **Yahrzeit Plaque**: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$350. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.


